Public Statement

Happy Goose Break to everyone!

The leadership continues to monitor Quebec’s announcements to reopen certain activity sectors in the province. The Cree Nation will continue to use caution and adapted measures appropriate for maintaining the health and safety of our communities.

Cree Board of Health and Social Services of James Bay

It has been challenging managing the physical distancing and precautionary measures especially during emotionally challenging times such as funerals which is a very important event in Cree culture. Special protocols have been distributed to those local representatives such as Public Safety Officers that provide the incredible support to families and leadership coordinating and managing logistics when it comes to funerals in our communities. The people who assume the responsibility for coordinating and assisting grieving families will need the support of leadership in ensuring the measures to protect the public are respected. It continues to be challenging times, but so long as we continue to fight and sacrifice for one another to protect the capacity of local health care systems and most importantly show patience for each other during these difficult times the Cree Nation will get through this pandemic stronger and even more resilient.

Eeyou Istchee remains stable with only 8 cases and there are only 7 that are in region: 2 have officially recovered, while the other 5 continue to be monitored and are considered active.

- 281 tests have been carried out
- 250 have tested negative
- 23 are awaiting test results

The Cree Health Board continues building its capacity to meet possible demands to respond to new cases or an increase in cases. The Cree Health Board is also monitoring neighboring jurisdictions very closely as a way of anticipating and preparing for what might be expected in our jurisdiction. The Cree Health Board is working hard to ensure capacity is there during goose break and hopes that the Cree Nation enjoys a successful harvest while respecting physical distancing and precautionary measures.

Cree School Board

In collaboration with the Cree Nation Government, the Cree School Board is modifying its capital plan for the upcoming construction season to comply with expected restrictions regarding construction.

The CSB continues to expand and implement online resources and is working to ensure the necessary devices are available for students.

Currently, end-year activities are being carried out in the schools and centres so that teachers who are leaving the communities will not have to return, keeping in line with the travel restrictions.

Management of Access to the North

The Cree leadership has met with Mayors from the southern municipalities to discuss the Government announcement of the opening of regions. All leaders, Cree and Jamesian, feel that it is a little too soon for the opening of the region and that the most appropriate action would be to develop a concrete plan for the opening of the region in close collaboration with both Directors of Public Health involved. This will be challenging because citizens in the region will find it hard seeing neighboring regions gaining greater freedoms. A public statement will be issued to explain the strategy and the importance of protecting local health care capacity.
